b) Explain Dayara Movement and its benefits to Church.

[Answer should be based on Lesson 30]

Dayara movement in Syrian church started from 3rd century.

- Circumstances that favoured Dayara Movement
 - Persecution from the dyophysite group after the Chalcedon council.
 - Earthquake in the first half of the 6th century.
 - Persian attack in AD 538.
 - Arab invasion in AD 638.

Benefits of Dayara movement:

- Church doctrines were safeguarded
 - Yacoob Burdana suffered for the church and helped save the church from dyophysite group's persecution.
 - Mar Barsouma (who was not a Metroplitan) was invited who to attend the Ephesus Council.
 - Many of the church fathers such as Shamavoon Destuno(initiated ascetic life and lived in caves) are remembered in Thubden as pillars of our church.
- In the fields of science, medicine, astrology history and theology Christians made significant contributions.
 - Mar Mathai dayara was well known center of learning in the 4th century.
 - Maphriyono Bar Hebraya (outstanding Syriac Grammarian) made valuable contributions to Syric literature, wrote many books.
- Church had permanent headquarters
 - Our Patriarchs used to live in Dayara of Mar Barsouma for long period of time (8th -13th century).
