1. How do we stand for Prayer?
We should stand facing east, folding hands on the chest.
2. To whom do we pray?
To the one and the only true God.

3. How do we make the sign of cross?

Hold the thumb, index and the middle fingers of the right hand together with the second one projected little forward and the other two fingers are kept folded. This signifies the unity of Trinity; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The second one is projected little forward to show that the second person in the Trinity, the Son, came down to the world. The cross is drawn starting from the forehead to the chest, and from the left shoulder to the right shoulder.

4. What is the meaning of making the sign of the cross?

The forehead denotes heaven; the chest earth, the left shoulder sinfulness and the right shoulder the state of the children of God. Our Lord and savior Jesus Christ came down from heaven to earth, taking human form to save us and change us from our sinful state to the state of the children of God by His death on the cross. When we make the sign of cross, we think of our salvation through the death of Christ on the cross.

5. When do we make the sign of the Cross?

- a) When entering a Church.
- b) When seeing a Church or the Cross.
- c) When saying or hearing the words 'the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit (Holy Trinity) and the word Cross (Sleebo) at the time of any prayer.

LESSON 4

GOD THE CREATOR

(Genesis Chapter 1 & 2)

Objective: To know that God is the creator of everything .

Look around you! How many trees, flowers, plants, animals and birds there are! Up above these is the blue sky. The sun gives us light and warmth. At night the moon shines, reflecting the light of the sun. There are also countless stars, which make the sky so beautiful. We see and enjoy all these beautiful objects. Long ago,



God Almighty created the heaven and the earth. But there was a time when these did not exist. Only God existed. He created everything including us. He created every thing by his expressed commands except man.

God wanted to make the earth beautiful. The first day He said, "Let there be light". As soon as God said these words there was light everywhere. God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light, 'day', and the darkness, 'night'. God continued this work

on the second day. He said, "Let there be a sky above the earth". Then the blue sky appeared. Clouds were formed and drifted up above the earth. God found that what he created was good.

The earth was covered with water. On the third day God said, "Let the waters under the sky gather together into one place and let the dry land appear", and it happened so. God called the dry land



'earth' and the waters He called 'seas'. He wanted to make the barren land beautiful. He made trees with sweet fruits and plants that bore beautiful flowers with attractive colors and fragrance. How beautiful the earth was now!

On the fourth day, God created more things to make the earth beautiful. He created sun to give light and warmth in the day and moon and the stars in the night. In the morning the sun rises in the east shedding light upon the earth. As time passes it goes up higher and higher and sets in the west leaving the charge to the moon to give light at night.

Then came the fifth day. On that day God created different kinds of fish in the water and beautiful flying birds in the air. God blessed all His creations.

On the sixth day God continued His creation. The different kinds of animals like cows, elephants, dogs, squirrels, rabbits and the reptiles like snakes and worms were created on that day. Then God created man as the crown of creations. God was very much pleased with all his creations.

God made man in His own 'image and likeness'. "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul" Gen 2:7. (God named the man Adam which means *Created from the ground*.) God created a beautiful garden for man. He named this garden Eden. He put Adam in this garden. To provide a companion for man God created woman. The Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam. God took one of man's ribs. From the rib of man, God made the woman (Gen 2:21). He named the woman Eve which means *the mother of all the living*. God brought all living creatures before Adam and Adam named them.

God created all of us. God's love is everlasting. Being His creation we must worship God. God created man to have fellowship with Him.

LESSON 5

DISOBEDIENCE

(Genesis Chapter 3)

Objective: To learn that disobedience is a sin.

Adam and Eve lived in the garden of Eden in great joy and happiness. They lived in obedience to the will of God and God loved them. God had commanded them not to eat or touch the fruit of the tree which was in the middle of the garden. But Satan was restless when he saw man enjoying fellowship with God. Satan assumed the form of a serpent and tempted Eve and persuaded her to eat the forbidden fruit. She ate and gave some to Adam. (Gen 3:1-7).

As a result of the disobedience, Adam and Eve were thrown out of the garden of Eden. Disobedience is sin and rebellion against the law of God. Sin caused chaos to the universe and humanity. The Serpent was clever enough to trap the first couple into disobedience against God. As soon as they disobeyed, they realized their nakedness. They took fig leaves and sewed them together to make coverings for themselves.

Adam and Eve realized that they had committed a sin. They were scared to face God or to stand in His presence.

God punished Adam and Eve. He increased pains in childbearing for Eve. He said to Adam that the earth is cursed because of his disobedience and that he will eat only through painful toil. God also felt sympathy for them and gave garments made of skin to protect their body from cold and heat. After that God drove them out of the garden of Eden into the world.

God cared for Adam and Eve even after they disobeyed His commandment. God's love is everlasting. Disobedience is a sin . We must obey the commandments of God.

One day, Cain and Abel went to worship God. Cain brought less than the best fruits of the ground as an offering to the Lord. Abel brought the best portions from the first born of his flock. God was not pleased with the offering of Cain. God was pleased with Abel and his offering.



Cain became jealous of his brother. He got angry. God warned Cain of his anger. God said to him, *“why are you so gloomy? If you do what is right, you will be accepted. If you do not, sin is lying at the door”*

He did not pay attention to the word of God. He was unwilling to reconcile with his brother. When we go to the temple of God with the best offering, God will bless us.

Cain could not subdue the sin in him. Cain acted as if he loved his brother. He took Abel to the field. There Cain got angry with Abel and beat him to death. See how he reacted to his brother? Abel did only good things in his life. Jealousy led Cain to kill his brother. God called Cain and asked him What have you done ? God cursed Cain to be a restless wanderer of the earth. Nobody can hide anything from God. God knows our thinking, talking and all our actions. A wicked person has no place before God.

LESSON 7

THE FATHER OF THE FAITHFUL

(Genesis 22: 1-19)

Objective: To know that we must keep firm faith in God even in our adversities.

About four thousand years ago, a God fearing man named Abraham lived in the land of Canaan. He became the ancestor of the Hebrews and of other nations (Gen 17: 15). He lived a life of complete faith in God. His wife's name was Sarah. The couple did not have any children.

God gave a special assurance to Abraham that he would have a son through whom a nation would rise. Isaac was born to Sarah and Abraham. Abraham was 100 years old when Isaac was born.



Isaac grew up into a boy. God wanted to test the faith of Abraham. God called him, "Abraham". "Here I am," Abraham replied. Then God said, *"Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the mount Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about"*.

Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on the shoulders of his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife.

And the two of them went on together. When they reached mount Moriah, Abraham built an altar and put the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the log of wood. Then he reached out and took the knife to slay his son. But the angel of the Lord called him from heaven and said, *"Abraham! Abraham! Do not lay hand on the boy. Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son"*.

Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide. And to this day it is said, "On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided".

God honored Abraham for his faith and obedience. Abraham received the honor of being known as the 'father of all believers'.

LESSON 8

MOSES - GOD'S PROVISION

(Exodus 2: 1-10)

Objective: To learn that God has plans and provides for those who believe and trust in Him.

The children of Abraham grew in number. They became a very big nation called Israel. They lived in Misraim (Egypt). They were foreigners



there. Pharaoh, the Egyptian king, and the Egyptians hated the Israelites. They were put into slavery in the land of Egypt. Once, Pharaoh issued an order to destroy all Hebrew male infants. Soldiers were appointed to implement this order. During this period Moses was born to Amram and his wife. They were very religious people. Moses had one elder brother, Aaron and elder sister, Miriam. Unfortunately, Pharaoh's order was so cruel, that soldiers would have killed the baby Moses if they knew about his birth. The whole family prayed with tears.

The family hid the child for two months. But it was impossible to hide the child any longer. They trusted in the power of the

Almighty God. When Moses was three months old, his mother made a basket of papyrus, and dabbled it with slime and pitch. She placed the child in the basket and put it by the bank of the river Nile. Moses' sister Miriam kept watching this basket. Then Pharaoh's daughter the Princess came to take bath in this river with her maid servants. She saw the child and felt pity and love for him. Moses was a very beautiful child. Miriam discreetly offered to find a nurse for the child. She brought the mother of Moses. Moses grew with his mother safely and was handed over to the Princess. The Princess called him Moses which means 'drawn out of water'. Moses grew up in the palace and became an outstanding leader. Later God used Moses to deliver Israel from Egypt.

The care of God for his children is illustrated in the story.

GOD ANSWERS PRAYERS

(I Samuel 1:1-28)

Objective: To learn that our Lord will never disregard the prayers of His children.

God kept the promise given to Abraham. The Israelites now occupied the land of Canaan and lived there. Their temple was located at Shiloh. Eli was the high priest. Elkanah was a pious Ephraimite during the time of Eli. Elkanah had two wives Hannah and Peninnah. Hannah was childless. But her husband loved her most. Peninnah had many children.

Elkanah took his family to Shiloh where the temple was located. He gave Peninnah and his sons and daughters their portions, but double portions to Hannah because she was beloved to him. She continued to pray before the altar with tears for getting a child. She made a vow that if God granted her a son, he would be dedicated to the service of the sanctuary. As she was praying before the altar and taking her vow, tears were dropping from her eyes. Eli, the high priest noticed Hannah. Eli could not hear anything because Hannah was sharing her grief with God silently. Eli thought Hannah was drunk. Eli scolded her.

Hannah with utmost humility told Eli, the high priest, that she should not be misunderstood. She was simply expressing her pain and agony of barrenness before the altar. Eli, being the anointed priest, blessed Hannah. He told her to go in peace and assured that God will grant her prayer. God heard the prayer of Hannah. She conceived and bore a son. They named him Samuel, saying, "Because I have asked for him of the Lord" (1 Samuel 1:20). Soon after Samuel was weaned, his parents took him to Eli and dedicated him for the service of the Lord. Samuel worshipped God and served Eli in his old age and received instruction from him. God loved Samuel and answered all his prayers. Samuel became the last judge of Israel.

LESSON 10

THE CALL OF THE LORD

(1. Samuel 3: 1-21)

Objective: To realize that we must be vigilant to listen to the call of God.

In our previous lesson we saw how the child Samuel came to live in the house of the Lord. He grew up as a model to all children. He learned the word of God from the old priest Eli. Samuel, even as a child, served in the house of the Lord with respect, humility and fear of the Lord. Unlike the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, Samuel treated the people who came to the house of the Lord to worship or to make sacrifices, with love and affection. As Samuel grew in age, he grew in stature and in favor both with the Lord and men. All people loved Samuel dearly.

Eli's two sons, Hophni and Phinehas were also priests. But they were not good persons. They were cruel and treated the people who came to worship in the house of the Lord badly. They even harassed the people who came to make sacrifices and stole the offerings they made. Eli loved his sons but did not stop them from their wrong doing. So the Lord became very angry with all three of them.

One day Samuel finished all his evening duties and was lying down in the house of the Lord. Eli was also lying down in his place to sleep. As Samuel was almost falling asleep he heard someone calling "Samuel". "*Here I am*" he answered, and ran to Eli and said, "Here I am Sir, for you called me." Eli answered, "*My son, I did not call you, you may go and sleep*". So Samuel went back to bed. Again as he was falling asleep he heard the voice "Samuel!" He opened his eyes and rushed to Eli. But Eli had not called him. So he went back to sleep and the third time the same thing happened. When Samuel came to Eli the third time, Eli understood that the Lord Himself was calling Samuel. So he told him, "*My son, if you hear your name again, say humbly, 'speak my Lord for Thy servant is listening'*".

Samuel went back to bed again. In a few minutes he heard the same voice calling again "Samuel, Samuel". As Eli had told him he answered, "*Speak my Lord, for Thy servant is listening.*"

Then the Lord spoke to Samuel. With much fear and respect, he listened to the words of God. The Lord told Samuel in detail about the punishment he had planned for Eli and his disobedient and proud sons.

Early in the morning Eli called Samuel, and asked him about the word of God. Though Samuel was very much frightened, he told everything to Eli, "*He is the Lord, let His will be done*", said Eli. Eli understood that Samuel is the Prophet of God. After the death of Eli, Samuel became the Judge of the people of Israel, and everyone loved and respected him.

We should be prepared to hear the voice of God. Only those who prepare themselves and listen to God can hear His voice.

LESSON 11

REAL FRIEND

Objective: To realize that a real friend helps without looking into his own personal gain

Samuel was the last Judge of the Israelites. In those days there was no king for the Jewish people. The Judge was the ruler of the people. The gentiles had kings. So the Israelites wished to have a king for themselves. So they prayed to the Lord. God selected a man called Saul to be their king. Samuel anointed him as the first king of Israelites. When he became king he changed his character. He became very proud and angered the Lord by his disobedience. Then God decided that David should be the king of Israelites instead of Saul. David was a small shepherd boy. While looking after his sheep, he used to play music on the harp. He became an expert in music. So he was appointed to play harp in front of the king in the palace. David was a very courageous and religious boy. He was loving and humble. People liked him very much and praised him even in front of the king. The king became very jealous of David. He even wanted to kill him,

because he feared that the people may make David their king instead of his son Jonathan who was of the same age as David.

David and Jonathan were very close friends. Jonathan loved David so dearly that he even pleaded to the king in favor of David. He told the king, "David is a poor shepherd boy, please do not hurt him. He is my best friend". The king made false promises to Jonathan just to make him happy. One day when David was playing harp in front of the king, he cast his spear at David to kill him. But David escaped by leaping to one side. He was sure that the king will try to kill him again. So he ran away from the palace. Saul sent his people after David to kill him. David met Jonathan in secret and told him everything that happened. Jonathan believed that God was with David, and he knew that David would one day become the King of Israel. He could never become the king if David was alive. So if he wanted he could very easily kill David or he could inform King Saul about David and get him killed because the king was searching for him. But Jonathan really loved David above all his personal motives. So he hid David in a secret place. Jonathan promised to let David know the plans of the king. He also agreed to inform David by some secret signs and codes if the king still hates him and wants to kill him, so that he can run away from the soldiers of the king.

Jonathan went to the palace. In the evening during supper time the king saw that the seat of David at the food table was empty. He got angry and asked why David was absent. Then Jonathan answered and said, "*He wanted to visit his parents. So I gave him permission to go to his home for a few days*".

Saul got very angry and scolded Jonathan saying, "*Even you are supporting him. Don't you know that you can never be the king as long as he is alive? You know where he is. Tell us so that we can get rid of him and thus you will be the king of Israel.*"

Now the life of David was in the hands of Jonathan. He knew where David was and could have killed him very easily. But he did not hesitate. He loved David so much that he went secretly to the hiding place of David and informed him everything that happened in the palace. Jonathan and David were very sorry. They embraced, cried bitterly and bid farewell to

each other with much grief. Jonathan helped David to escape and run away from their land. See how good a friend Jonathan was!

After some time both Saul and Jonathan were killed in battle. The people made David the King of Israel. He was the greatest king of Israel. David was a king who trusted and served the Lord wholeheartedly. When he became king, David did not forget Jonathan's friendship towards him. He remembered how Jonathan helped him. So he brought the only son of Jonathan, who was paralyzed, to the palace. He was taken care of by David in the palace as a prince throughout his life. David helped his friend even after his death. We should not forget our friends who help us when we are in need.

THE TRUE GOD

(2. Kings 5: 1-19)

Objective: To know that Lord is the true God.

In the last lesson we learned that there were kings to rule Israel. But before long the country was divided into two kingdoms. One was called Israel and its capital was the city of Samaria. The other was called Judea, and its capital was Jerusalem. During this time there was a prophet named Elisha in Samaria. A prophet is one sent by God to advise the people to keep the commandments of God when they go astray from the path of the Lord and lead bad lives. Since the prophet is someone chosen by the Lord, he could perform miracles and cure any kind of sickness.

The people of Israel sinned and angered the Lord. He punished them as a result of their sin. The king of Syria invaded the City of Samaria and plundered it. Many were captured and taken to their land as slaves. Among them there was a beautiful, well-behaved girl. Naaman the Commander of the army of Syria took her and gave her to his wife as a maid servant. They called her Judith (which simply means Jewish girl). Judith was a very religious girl. She respected Elisha, the prophet of God and worshiped the Lord of Israel.

Naaman was very much honored by the king and was given high position in the palace. But unfortunately he was a leper and was very unhappy. Leprosy was a terrible sickness with decaying sores and had no treatment in those days. Judith believed that Elisha, the prophet of the Lord could cure him. She wanted to help her master. But Naaman was an idol worshipper. He never knew the True God. So she was afraid of her master. But one day she told her mistress, *"I believe that if master goes to Elisha, the prophet of the Lord in the city of Samaria, he will definitely get cured"*.

As Naaman was suffering too much from his sickness he was ready to try any means to get cured. So he told the king what Judith told his wife. The king told him that he will give a letter to the king of Israel. So Naaman went to Samaria with some gifts to the king

and presented the letter from the king of Syria. The letter said, *“I send Naaman to you, that you may heal him of his leprosy”*. Poor king of Israel, what can he do? He became very frightened and said, *“Am I God to kill and to make alive, that this man sends a man to heal him of his leprosy? He is simply finding a means to quarrel and make war”*. The king did not know what to do. He became very sorrowful and tore his clothes, according to their custom during the time of sorrows.

Elisha, the prophet heard about this. He sent messengers asking the king of Israel to send Naaman to him. Naaman came to the door of Elisha’s house. But Elisha did not come out to receive him. Instead he sent his servants to Naaman and told him to go to the river Jordan and wash seven times in the water and get cured. Naaman got very angry, because the prophet did not come out and receive him or honor him. He said very angrily, *“Do we not have better rivers and cleaner waters in our land?”*

He decided to return to his country. Then his servants pacified him saying, *“Master, if the man of God had come out to you and told you to do something harder or difficult, wouldn’t you have tried that? Now this is very simple thing to go and wash seven times in river Jordan. Why not try it before you return to Syria?”*

Naaman agreed although reluctantly. He went to the river Jordan. He dipped himself seven times in the water according to the instruction of the man of God. What a surprise! He looked at his body. All the sores had disappeared. His skin became so soft and clean, like the skin of a baby. He was completely cured. He was filled with happiness and gratitude. He felt sorry that he got angry with the man of God. So he returned to the door steps of Elisha. With fear and respect in his heart he said to the prophet, *“The God of Israel is the True God. Hereafter we will worship only Him”*. Naaman returned to his country happily.

The ways of God are wonderful. They are mysterious. We will not be able to understand them fully. But if you obey them unconditionally without any doubt, then you will be blessed. Because of Judith’s love of God, Naaman came to know and worship the True God.

LESSON 13

MARY'S DEDICATION

(St. Luke 1: 26-38)

Objective: To learn that God abides with the humble and pure.

We learned that Adam and Eve sinned by disobeying God. As the descendents of Adam and Eve, the whole mankind became slaves of satan and death. God is the loving Father. God, the Father loves mankind. He so loved mankind that he decided to send His only begotten Son to this world to save mankind from the slavery of satan and death. The Son of God decided to become man. There are many things impossible for us human beings. There are limitations on our abilities, intelligence and power. But God is Almighty. There is nothing impossible for Him. So it was possible for Him to be born as a human baby. The Son of God is equal with the Father and the Holy Spirit. But He emptied Himself from that position and became a human to redeem us from the slavery of sin and restore us as the children of God. See how great God's love is!

When Adam and Eve sinned, God punished them by sending them out of the Garden of Eden. But at the same time, He promised that the Son of woman would bruise the head of the serpent that persuaded Eve to commit sin. So God decided to take human form from a woman. There was a beautiful innocent girl in the town of Nazareth in Galilee. Her name was Mary. She was betrothed to a man by name Joseph, a carpenter. According to the custom of the land she was under the care of Joseph. As they were not married, she was a virgin. God selected Mary to be the mother of the Son of God. God sent the angel Gabriel to Mary with this message.

Gabriel, the messenger of God greeted Mary by saying,
"Hail Mary, full of grace, our Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women".

What a great greeting! Gabriel, the angel who stands in the presence of God, is the one greeting Mary like this, which means that this greeting is from God Himself. The Virgin Mary received the greeting and heard the message which none before or after has ever heard. See how she was exalted by God? Mary was frightened and was trembling with fear and wondered what kind of a salutation this could be! The angel told Mary, *“Don't be afraid. You have received favors from God. You will conceive and give birth to a son. You must call him by the name Jesus. He will be called the Son of God. His kingdom shall have no end”*.

This is the life saving message. *“The Son of God becomes man to save humanity”*.

That is the greatest good news - The Gospel -. Who was informed first about this Great Gospel? None other than Mary, who was to receive the Son of God in her womb, was the first to be informed of this message.

She said, *“How can this be, for I am not yet married”*.

Gabriel told her, *“The power of the Highest shall come upon you. The Holy Spirit will dwell on you. So the one who shall be born of you will be called the Son of God”*.

Mary became pregnant miraculously by the power of God because the Holy Spirit came upon her. Gabriel told her again, *“Your relative Elizabeth who was thought to be a barren woman is also pregnant in her old age. For God nothing is impossible”*.

Mary very humbly bowed her head and said, *“Behold, I am the hand maid of the Lord. Let it be for me as you said”*. She dedicated completely to God. What humility! God rejoices with those who are really humble. Because of her humility she became eligible to be the mother of the Son of God. Gabriel disappeared from the sight of Mary. God Himself chose Mary to be the mother of His Son. The Child to whom she has given birth is the Son of God. So she is definitely the mother of God.

BIRTH OF JESUS

(St. Luke 2: 1-20)

Objective: To learn that the pure in heart will hear good news from God.

We learned in the last lesson that Mary was betrothed to Joseph and that she was carrying Jesus in her womb.

In those days, the land of Judea was ruled by the emperor of Rome. Caesar Augustus was the ruler at that time. He proclaimed that all the people should be registered for the purpose of census according to their tribe and lineage. Joseph, being in the lineage of king David, had to go to Bethlehem, the city of David with his betrothed wife Mary to be registered. In those days the only means of transportation was mules or camels. It was a five-day journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem. As there was no other choice, Joseph started the journey with Mary who was in the late stage of pregnancy. You can imagine how tiresome it would be for Mary to undertake such a journey. When they reached Bethlehem there were big crowds everywhere. People from all over had to come to the city for the purpose of registration. Joseph tried all places for a room to sleep. He could not get a place. All the inns and rooms in the hotels were already filled. It was time for Mary to give birth. She was in labor. Joseph searched everywhere frantically. Finally he took Mary to a cave where the cattle were kept. There she gave birth to the baby. He made a little space in the manger to keep the child and for Mary. She wrapped her baby in swaddling clothes and laid him in the manger. Who is this baby? The Son of God! The creator of the whole universe! See how humble His birth is. In a manger! Among the cattle! Wrapped in swaddling clothes! What a wonderful birth!

This wonderful birth was proclaimed by the angels to the world. In the open fields near the city of Bethlehem, there were some poor shepherds watching over their sheep in the night. Suddenly a bright light surrounded them. The glory of God shone on them. They were frightened. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and told them, "Do not be frightened, for I announce to you the greatest tidings that is to happen to the whole mankind.

The savior of the world, Jesus Christ is born today in Bethlehem, the city of David. This will be your sign, you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger”. Suddenly a multitude of heavenly hosts appeared with that angel and started singing praises. “Glory to God in the highest, on earth, peace, and good will towards men”. The shepherds were frightened and surprised. See how God chose the poor innocent shepherds who were watching over their flocks alertly during the night to receive this great news. If we are also pure in heart and innocent and do our duties wholeheartedly, God will choose us also to hear the good news.

The shepherds said to one another, “Let us go up to Bethlehem and witness this great thing that the angel of the Lord told us about”. Immediately they left for Bethlehem and to the manger. As the angel informed them they saw the baby Jesus wrapped in swaddling clothes in the manger with his mother Mary and Joseph. They worshipped the baby and told Mary and Joseph what they saw and heard from the angel. Everyone was surprised. The shepherds returned to their flocks praising the Lord. Mary remembered all of these things in her heart and meditated.

LESSON 15

THE STAR OF NATIVITY

(St. Matthew Chapter- 2)

Objective: To show that men cannot change God's will.

The teacher to note :-Though we have no direct evidence in the scriptures, by tradition we believe that the Magi (m'gushe -Syr.) were three wise men from the East. From St. Matthew 2: 11, we learn that the Magi paid their respects to the Infant Jesus in a house.

When the infant Jesus was born, a star rose in the east. The wise men of the region recognized that it indicated the birth of the Eternal King promised by God to the Jews. They set out to Jerusalem to worship



the Divine King. It took them several days to reach the palace at Jerusalem, where King Herod reigned.

The Magi asked about the King of the Jews. King Herod was deeply troubled to hear that the Jews would have a king other than

him. He summoned the scholars and the priests and asked, "Where will the Messiah be born?" They replied, "Bethlehem, in Judea." King Herod found out from the Magi when exactly they spotted the star. He sent them to Bethlehem. He requested them to find out where the child was and report back to him so that he could worship the newborn himself. King Herod had evil intentions when he said this. He was determined to kill the infant. His intentions were no secret to God. The Magi set out to proceed to Bethlehem. They saw the star again. It guided them as they went. When they reached the birthplace of the infant, the star stopped moving. The wise men went into the home and saw the Divine Infant with His mother Mary. They knelt before Him, worshipped Him, and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

When night fell, the angel of God appeared to the Magi. The angel told them, "Do not return to Herod." The wise men returned to their native land avoiding Herod. After the wise men left, the angel of God appeared to Joseph, "*Herod is seeking the infant to kill Him. Start out immediately for Mizraim (Egypt). Stay there until I command you to return,*" the angel told him. Joseph immediately left for Mizraim with Mary and infant Jesus. What a caring foster father? See the loving care of God!

When Herod realized that the Magi returned avoiding him, he was enraged. He calculated the age of the child from the time the star appeared to the wise men. "*He cannot be more than two years of age,*" he said to himself. The cruel King decided to kill every infant of age two or less, in and around Bethlehem. Several infants were martyred. We remember them on December 27th. The infant Jesus was unhurt. God's will cannot be changed by the power of men. We must rather know God's great power and depend on it in our lives.

Herod died after a while. The angel of God appeared to Joseph again and told him to return from Mizraim. They returned to Nazareth in Galilee and lived there. The Son of God was born as man for the sake of all men of the world. He is the Savior of all men irrespective of their race or nationality. The gospel of good tidings was for the benefit of all.

LESSON 16

JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

The Ideal Boy
(St. Luke 2:41-51)

Objective: To understand that we go to the house of God to pray to Him and to listen to His words.

The infant Jesus grew up in Nazareth with His mother Mary and His foster-father Joseph. As the infant grew up, He gained a great deal of knowledge. The boy showed great interest in praying and obeying God's laws. Mary brought her son up with dedication. She experienced several miracles during this time. The blessed mother used to meditate on those events.

Mary and Joseph used to observe 'passover' at the Temple in Jerusalem every year. Jesus used to go with them. (We also observe

'passover' every year. We partake in the Holy Mysteries on that day. You should never fail to do so. You will learn more about the Holy Qurbono {Eucharist} and the 'passover' in the years ahead.)

All the Jewish families of Nazareth used to go together, by foot, to Jerusalem so that they could observe 'passover'. The journey took four to five days. They used to carry all the food they needed on the way. They would proceed in groups singing Psalms. They then returned from Jerusalem the same way.

The year Jesus turned twelve, He went to Jerusalem to observe the 'passover' as in the past. Thousands of Israelites arrived at Jerusalem to observe the 'passover'. Several merchants also arrived to sell their wares. The city was very crowded. Many came not only to pray but also for sightseeing. We go to the House of God to pray. We must be in the presence of God all the time we are there. The Boy Jesus prayed with His parents, gave offerings, and worshipped God with great devotion.

Other attractions or the wares of the merchants did not distract Jesus. He was attracted only by what pleased God most. In the Temple, He found several scholars of the law reading from and understanding the Holy Law of God. Jesus approached them. When they saw the little Boy amongst them they were amused. They asked Him questions about the Law of God. They were amazed at His answers and His knowledge. The Rabbi seated Him in their midst and conversed with Him. Hours went by.

By then, Mary and Joseph had started back to Nazareth with their people. They did not realize that Jesus was not with them. They assumed that He would be with His friends, as usual. It was after a day's journey that they realized that Jesus was not with them. When they couldn't find Him among their relatives and friends they were deeply troubled. With grief they went back searching for Him. Three days later they found Him in the Temple seated amongst the scholars of the Law answering their questions, exhibiting His wisdom. They could not believe what they saw. Mary chided her son, "Son, what have you done. Your father and I have searched for you with much grief." Jesus asked her, "Why did you have to search for me? Didn't you know that I had to be in my Father's house? He

left immediately with His mother and went to Nazareth. He lived with His parents in obedience to them. His mother meditated on this event.

We understand that Jesus was an obedient boy. He grew up loving and obeying His parents. Like Jesus, we must also grow up in obedience to our parents.

LESSON 17

WATER CHANGED TO WINE

(St. John:2:1-11)

Objective: To learn that Jesus is the Lord of all things.



Jesus grew up with His mother, Mary and his foster father, Joseph in Nazareth. As he grew up, he was strengthened by God's blessings. Children who obey their parents will get God's blessings and long life as promised in the fifth commandment.

When Jesus was thirty-years-old, He began his public ministry. As He traveled through Galilee, Jesus taught about the kingdom of God, and about repentance. Jesus had many followers. Among these followers Jesus chose twelve people whom He called Apostles, which means, "People who were sent"

Cana is a small town in Galilee. Cana is near Nazareth. Once there was a wedding in Cana. Mary and Jesus were invited to the wedding. Mary came early to help prepare for the occasion because Mary was related to that family. Jesus and His disciples arrived at the time of the wedding. While the feast was in progress, they ran out of wine. In wedding feasts of Cana, it was customary to serve wine to the guests. The host would not have expected wine to run out. The feast would be ruined if wine could not be served. It would be such a disgrace for the host. Mary realized that they needed help. She recognized that her Son was the only one who could help them at that time. She knew He was the Son of God. She had the freedom to ask Him. She told Him, *"They have no wine."* Jesus replied, *"What does your concern have to do with me? My hour has not yet come."*

Mary understood that He was not denying her request. She knew well what her Son would do. Among the people there, Mary was the only one who believed that He was the Son of God. Without any doubts in her mind, she told the servants in the house, "Whatever He says to you, do it."

Jesus did not refuse His mother's request. Even though His time had not arrived, He fulfilled His mother's request. There were six huge stone jars in the house. Jesus told the servants, *"Fill the jars with water."* He then said to them, *"Draw some out now and take it to the master of the feast."*

Only if the master of the feast is satisfied that the wine tastes good can it be served at the feast. When he tasted what the servants brought him, he was amazed. How good it tasted. He called the bridegroom aside and said to him, *"Every man sets out the best wine at the beginning, and when the guests have well drunk, they set out other wine that isn't as good."*

But you have kept the best wine until now.”

When the servants and Jesus' disciples realized that the water had turned into wine, they were very surprised. The disciples began to believe in His divinity. Jesus performed the first miracle fulfilling His mother's request. The Savior of the world is a caring son too. The skies, the earth, and all the powers therein are under His control. This is what the first miracle of Jesus teaches us.

LESSON 18

(St. Mark 10:13-16; St. Matthew 19:13-15; St. Luke 18:15-17)

GOD OUR LOVING FATHER

(St. Luke 15: 11-32)

Objective: To learn that God is our loving Father

God is our Father. He loves us. Jesus is the Son of God, who came down from heaven to save us from our sins. When we sin, God grieves; when we renounce sin and return to God, He rejoices. When we confess our sins and ask for forgiveness, God pardons and happily receives us. Jesus taught us about God's forgiveness through the parable of the prodigal son.

Once a certain rich man had two sons. The younger one asked his father his share of the property. So the man divided the property between his two sons. The younger son sold his part of the property and left home with the money. He surely thought that he could have an easy life, without his father to control him. He went to a place far away. There he made a lot of friends. He wasted his money by recklessly spending it. When he ran out of all his money, his friends left him. This shows us that we have to be careful when we choose our friends. Then a severe famine hit that country and he was left without anything. He wandered without food. He could not bear his hunger. He went to work for a farmer. The farmer sent him to take care of the pigs. He worked there for food. But he was still hungry. He wished he could eat the bean pods that the pigs ate. But he was not even allowed to eat that.

Then he thought of his home and his father, of all the sins he had committed, and then he repented. He said, "In my father's house servants have enough to eat and to spare, while I starve here. I will go back to my father and say, *"Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your servants."* This is true repentance. He got up and went back to his father.

His father saw him from far away. The father was waiting for his son's return for a long time. His heart was filled with compassion. He ran towards his son and threw his arms around him

and kissed him. The son wept and said, *“Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.”*

But the father called his servants and told them, *“Bring the best robe and put on him. Put a ring on his finger and shoes on his feet. Then go and get the fattened calf and kill it. Let us eat and be merry, because my son was dead, but now he is alive; he was lost and now he has been found.”* And so the celebration began.

In the meantime the elder son was out in the field. On his way back, when he came near the house, he heard the music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked him what was going on. When he found out the news he was so angry that he would not go into the house. So his father came out and requested him to come in. The elder son answered his father, *“All these years I have served you, and I never disobeyed you. You never gave me anything to celebrate with my friends. But your younger son wasted all your property, and when he came back home you killed the fattened calf for him.”*

The father replied, *“My son, you are always here with me and all my property is yours. But your brother was dead, but now he is alive; he was lost and now he has been found. So we have to celebrate and be happy.”*

When a person sins, he is dead to God. But when he repents and comes back to God, he lives again. God, the Father gladly receives him and angels in the heaven rejoice over him.
